Companies will need to be bold

- Leakage will be a big issue for PR24. It's one of the three factors in ensuring we meet demand in the 2030s - and as part of the asset health debate
- The routemap has identified some big challenges ahead. It will not be easy, so we have to be creative, increase collaboration – and be bold!

For example....

- Anglian, Portsmouth, South West, Affinity (plus Jacobs, Skanska, Imperial, Airbus, Microsoft and Sheffield University) won £7.5M in Ofwat's first Water Breakthrough Challenge.
- We will use AI to improve resilience to climate change by predicting vulnerabilities around leakage, interruptions, and pressure issues

We want to build on the UK's reputation as a leader



- Our work on the routemap has involved us talking to a number of international partners across the World. They have told us the UK has always been seen as an international leader on leakage, and willing to push boundaries.
- We want to build on that. The innovation work, and a new national strategy in the form of a routemap, will demonstrate our purpose and ambition.
- Aquatec Netherlands, the SWAN Forum and the Global Leakage Summit 2022 will be important opportunities to take this forward – both for grabbing new ideas, and for demonstrating our own direction.
